

SATURDAY

St Anthony Claret, Bishop Our Lady on Saturday

Anthony was born in Spain in 1807 and died in exile in France in 1870. Appointed Archbishop of Santiago he aroused opposition for his spiritual and social reforms and for championing the rights of the indigenous peoples. He is remembered for his work of religious renewal through the spoken and printed word.

St John Paul II, Pope

Karol J. Wojtyla, known as John Paul II since his October 1978 election to the papacy. His apostolic zeal, particularly for families, young people and the sick, led him to numerous pastoral visits throughout the world.

Before the world was made, he chose us in Christ.

Responsorial Psalm:

Gospel: Luke 12: 49-53

I am here not to bring peace but division.

Communion Antiphon:

St John Capistrano, Priest

Alleluia, Alleluia! Harden not your hearts today, but listen to the voice of the Lord. Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 12: 54-59

Do you know how to interpret these times?

Communion Antiphon:

Behold, the eyes of the Lord are on those who fear him, who hope in his merciful love, to rescue their souls from death, to keep them alive in famine.
