Almighty ever-living God, who gather what is scattered and keep together what you have gathered, Look kindly on the flock of your Son, that those whom one Baptism has consecrated May be joined together by integrity of faith and united in the bond of charity. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **AMEN**

Reader 1:

'The restoration of the unity among all Christians is one of the principal concerns of the Second Vatican Council. Christ the Lord founded one Church only. However, many Christian communions present themselves to mankind as the true inheritors of Jesus Christ; all indeed profess to be followers of the Lord but they differ in mind and go their different ways, as if Christ himself were divided. Certainly, such division openly contradicts the will of Christ, scandalizes the world, and damages the most holy cause, the preaching of the Gospel to every creature. The Lord of Ages nevertheless wisely and patiently follows out the plan of his grace on our behalf, sinners that we are. In recent times he has begun to bestow more generously upon divided Christians remorse over their divisions and longing for unity. The Sacred Council...wishes to set before all Catholics guidelines, helps and methods, by which they too can respond to the grace of this divine call.'

Reader 1:

'The term 'ecumenical movement' indicates the initiatives and activities encouraged and organised, according to the various needs of the Church and as opportunities offer, to promote Christian unity. These are: first, every effort to avoid expressions, judgements and actions which do not represent ...truth and fairness and so make mutual relations...more difficult. Then 'dialogue' between competent experts from different Churches and communities...Through such dialogue everyone gains a truer knowledge and more just appreciation of the teaching and religious life of both communions. In addition, these communions engage in that more intensive cooperation in carrying out any duties for the common good of humanity...They also come together for common prayer...Finally, all are led to examine their own faithfulness to Christ's will for the Church and, wherever necessary, undertake with vigour the task of renewal and reform.'

Reader 1:

'In ecumenical work, Catholics must assuredly be concerned for their separated brethren, praying for them, keeping them informed about the Church, making the first approaches toward them. But their primary duty is to make a careful and honest appraisal of whatever needs to be renewed and done in the Catholic household itself, in order that its life may bear witness more clearly and faithfully to the teaching and institutions which have been handed down from Christ through the apostles. For although the Catholic Church has been endowed with all divinely revealed truth and with all means of grace, yet its members fail to live by them with all the fervour that they should. As a result the radiance of the Church's face shines less brightly in the eyes of other Christians and of the world at large, and the growth of God's Kingdom is retarded. Every Catholic must therefore aim at Christian perfection...In all things let charity prevail.'
